JUNE IS NATIONAL REUNIFICATION MONTH: CELEBRATING FAMILIES WORKING TO CREATE A BRIGHTER FUTURE

June is celebrated as <u>National Reunification Month</u>, a significant occasion within the child welfare community. This annual observance was established in 2010 by the American Bar Association Center on Children and the Law, along with other national partners, to highlight reunification as the *most desirable and positive legal permanency outcome for children*. It serves as a time to honor families who have successfully reunified with their children after their placement in the child welfare system.

Reunification stands as the primary permanency option achieved by the majority of children in the child welfare system, as foster care is *designed to be a temporary solution rather than a permanent arrangement*. Hence, June presents an opportunity to acknowledge the individuals and organizations that contribute to family preservation efforts. One such program is the Children's Aid Society's Family Partners Program, which aids families in overcoming obstacles to establish a safe and stable home environment for their children.

We recognize that children thrive when they can safely remain with their parents and extended family members. To facilitate a smoother reunification process, our program offers services such as:

- Therapy
- Basic living skills training, and
- · In-home case management

Over the past five years, <u>Family Partners</u> has successfully supported **381 families** in reuniting with their children through intensive in-home services. We are proud of the commitment of these families and the service our Family Partners team provides.

As always community support and advocating for programs like Family Partners is needed and appreciated. Thanks to each and every one of you, for helping to spread awareness about reunification and the work Children's Aid Society of Alabama performs each day to help change lives, build families and strengthen communities.
