# MATCHING IN MARCH: FINDING FOREVER

The goal of foster care is working toward family reunification. That goal is not always achieved, and as a result, over 200 children across the state of Alabama are awaiting the possibility of joining a forever family. Brittany Popham has worked with Children's Aid Society of Alabama for five years. She currently serves as the Alabama Pre/Post Adoption Connections (APAC) Adoptive Family Recruiter.

"People often think adoption is an expensive process, and they've told me that it has kept them from learning more about adoption in Alabama. When we actually get to speak with people and let them know that adopting a child from Alabama foster care is free, they're shocked! We really work with people and walk them through the entire adoption process."

The process begins with **Trauma Informed Partnering for Safety & Permanence (TIPS)** group classes. These classes are required for anyone interested in becoming a foster or adoptive parent in Alabama. Our TIPS classes will begin this spring in the cities of Birmingham, Montgomery, Huntsville and Mobile. You must be over 19 years of age to foster or adopt a child, you can be a single parent or married. If married, your marriage must be of at least 3 years duration. "We are really in need of more loving families. When the Covid-19 pandemic began, there was slightly more interest in adoption. Now that things have started to get back to normal...interest has kind of dwindled."
